Design topics include the use of fragrance in garden design, soil amendments and bio char, a historic perspective of landscape architecture and the evolution of outdoor lighting in landscapes.

Christopher Barrett Sheridan is an award-winning civic educator, pursuing a second career in horticulture and planting design. Chris specializes in scented plants, cottage garden design, Arts and Crafts garden design, the language of flowers, garden history, and heirloom plants.

Chris is an instructor with Longwood Gardens and a returning presenter at the Philadelphia Flower Show. He has been published in *The American Gardener*. Chris has a Certificate in Ornamental Horticulture from Longwood Gardens and also holds degrees from Villanova and Tulane Law School. Chris is an active member of GardenComm, the Garden Bloggers Fling, American Public Gardens Association and the Hardy Plant Society.

Mark Highland first pushed a shovel into garden soil on a beautiful piece of Illinois farmland. After he "grew up," Mark focused his M.S. degree studies in the Longwood Graduate Program on compost and potting soil. Mark started The Organic Mechanic Soil Company, LLC in 2006, and serves as president of Organic Mechanics. Mark has served as a consultant for the EPA and Institute for Local Self-Reliance. Mark is the author of the recently published *Practical Organic Gardening: The No-Nonsense Guide to Growing Naturally*.

Peter Butler is professor and Extension specialist in landscape architecture at West Virginia University (WVU). He established the Community Engagement Lab at WVU connecting faculty and students to community projects to increase capacities towards progress and revitalization. His research interests include cultural landscape history, community design process, industrial landscape reclamation and interpretation, and design studio pedagogy. Before graduate school, he worked as a gardener in Massachusetts, Idaho, and Washington.
